Leukaemia Foundation CEO, Chris Tanti said it's time we stopped blood cancer in its tracks and is encouraging the Australian community to come together for this year's World's Greatest Shave.

"Every strand of hair that Australians change during the World's Greatest Shave will make living with blood cancer less scary, isolating and stressful for those diagnosed," said Mr Tanti.

"Blood cancer can impact anyone, of any age, from anywhere. In Australia today, sadly 17 people will lose their life to the disease.

"That's 17 parents, children, siblings, friends, workplaces and communities who lose someone important to them and are affected by the devastating impact of blood cancer."

The Leukaemia Foundation is appealing to Australians to get behind the World's Greatest Shave with Mr Tanti adding that there has never been a more vital time to support this iconic and much-loved campaign.

“By signing up to the World’s Greatest Shave, you are helping to ensure that blood cancer patients have access to the right information, support and care they need to face their diagnosis, as well as someone to turn to every step of the way.

“Funds raised also enable the Leukaemia Foundation to continue supporting this country’s brightest and best blood cancer researchers and scientists to find better treatment options for blood cancer patients, and hopefully, one day, a cure.”

Since 2000, the Leukaemia Foundation has funded over 370 blood cancer research grants, representing over \$90.1 million in blood cancer research funding in today’s current dollar value.

The World’s Greatest Shave provides the perfect opportunity for Aussies to support blood cancer research whilst also getting a new ‘do’ and the hairstyle they’ve always wanted – whether that’s a full shave, pixie cut, a fresh fade, a bob, or something else entirely.

“How you choose to participate in the 28th World’s Greatest Shave, and the way in which you share this with your community is entirely up to you,” said Mr Tanti.

“We know that shaving, cutting, or colouring your hair is a big deal and by participating in the World’s Greatest Shave, people are not only changing their hairstyle, but also becoming walking, talking billboards for blood cancer support and research.”
